Draws:

The draw for the Team Events will be performed on 5th December, 15:00 at Hotel Husa Calle Serrano Jover 1, 28015 Madrid following the Delegates' Meeting; for the Singles (First Stage) and Doubles events the draws will be performed on 7th December.

TV Coverage:

Madrid sets a new TV standard for Junior table tennis; the host broadcaster VAV secured high definition (HDTV) coverage for the final matches of the World Table Tennis Championships.

For the first time in the history of this tournament, it will produce in the state-of-the-art digital system with a higher resolution. With one day delay, the Spanish TV audience can see the finals of the Team event as well as the Singles and Doubles finals on channel 9 of Canal+.

Negotiations for a broadcast outside of Spain are in progress.

The International Table Tennis Federation

The ITTF was founded as a result of discussions initiated in Berlin by **Dr Georg Lehmann** (Germany) on 15th January 1926. The English representatives at these discussions issued an invitation to London at the end of 1926, the first table tennis World Championships.

A General Meeting and World Championships were held next in Stockholm in January 1928 and thereafter annually until 1939, by which time 28 Associations had affiliated to the ITTF.

the ITTF was headed from the outset by **Ivor Montagu** (England), initially as Chairman of the Advisory Committee and from 1937, when the position was first established, as President. Montagu retired in 1967 and was succeeded by **Roy Evans** (Wales, 1967 – 1987), **Ichiro Ogimura** (Japan, 1987 – 1994), **Lollo Hammarlund** (Sweden, 1994 – 1995), **Xu Yinsheng** (China, 1995 – 1999) and **Adham Sharara** (Canada, 1999 – the present).

Largely as the result of Roy Evans' efforts, table tennis was recognised in 1977 as an Olympic sport and was included for the first time in the **1988 Olympic Summer Games in Seoul**. Today the ITTF has three offices. The headquarters is in Lausanne/Renens, Switzerland, the President's office in Ottawa, Canada and the Asia/Pacific office in Beijing, China.

The ITTF is staging a **World Championship** event every year. Team World Championships are played in even years (2008 in Guangzhou, China; 2010 in Moscow, Russia), Individual (Singles and Doubles) World Championships in odd years (2007 in Zagreb, Croatia; 2009 in Yokohama, Japan).

The **ITTF Pro Tour** was implemented in 1996. On the 2008 Pro Tour there was an overall prize money of about two million US dollar. The **ITTF Junior Circuit** started in 2002. The first Junior Circuit Finals and Cadet Challenge were held 2003 in Genting, Malaysia.

Timeline of Table Tennis Milestones

1880s	Adaption of lawn tennis to the dining table with improvised equipment
1890s	Several patents registered in England and the USA Manufactured sets produced under trade names such as Gossima, and Indoor Tennis, with Lawn Tennis style rules
1900	Introduction of celluloid balls to replace rubber and cork ones. The celluloid ball had the perfect bounce, and the game became a huge success
1901	The game is introduced in China via western settlements
1922	Establishment of standard laws of the Game in England
1926	International Table Tennis Federation (ITTF) initiated in Berlin First World Championships held in London, England.
1920s – 50s	Classic Hard Bat Era (European Dominance)
1926 – 31	Maria Mednyanszky (HUN) wins the world championships five times consecutively. Mednyanszky wins 18 gold medals over-all
1930 – 35	Victor Barna (HUN) becomes five times world. Barna wins a record 22 gold medals at world championships during his career, 40 medals overall
1936	Tenth World Championships held in Prague, Czechoslovakia. The longest rally took place, the first point taking over two hours
1950 – 55	Angelica Rozeanu-Adelstein (ROU) wins the World Championships six times in a row and is the last non Asian to win the female singles title until today
1950s – 80s	Age of Sponge Bat and Technology (Beginning of Asian Dominance)
1952	Hiroji Satoh (JPN) became the first player to win a world championship when using a racket covered with thick sponge and is the first non-European winner
1953	China entered the Championships for the first time
1956	Tomie Okada-Okawa (JPN) is the first female player from Asia to win the World Championships and stops the European reign on world's female table tennis.
1958	First European Championships , Budapest, Hungary. The USSR made their entry to the international scene
1959	Rong Guotuan (CHN) is the first Chinese world champion in any sport
1971	Ping Pong Diplomacy : table tennis played an important role in international diplomacy when several teams were invited to China for a series of friendship matches after the 1971 World Championships. Chinese Premier Zhou Enlai : "Your visit to China has opened the door for people-to-people exchanges between China and the USA."
1971	Stellan Bengtsson (SWE) wins the men's singles title and heralds the start of three decades of Swedish influence , with top players such as Kjell Johansson, Mikael Appelgren, Erik Lindh, Jan-Ove Waldner, Jörgen Persson, and Peter Karlsson

1982 First World Championships for the **disabled** held in Stoke Mandeville, England

Modern Olympics Era (Chinese Reign with few exceptions)

1988 For the very first time, table tennis was featured in the **Olympic Games** that were held in Seoul, South Korea

1996 Beginning of the **ITTF Pro Tour**, with events taking place all around the world

2000 After the Olympics in Sydney, the **ball size** is increased to 40mm for improved television viewing

2001 Game score changed from **21 to 11** points

2002 Implementation of the ITTF Junior Circuit (U18) and Cadet Challenge (U15 continental team competition)

2003 First ITTF World Junior Championships in Santiago, Chile

2004 During the Olympic Games in Athens, Table Tennis **ranked 5th among all sports for television** viewing audience

2007 First appearance of table tennis as a compulsory sport at the **Universiade** in Bangkok, Thailand

2010 Table tennis is part of the first **Youth Olympic Games**
